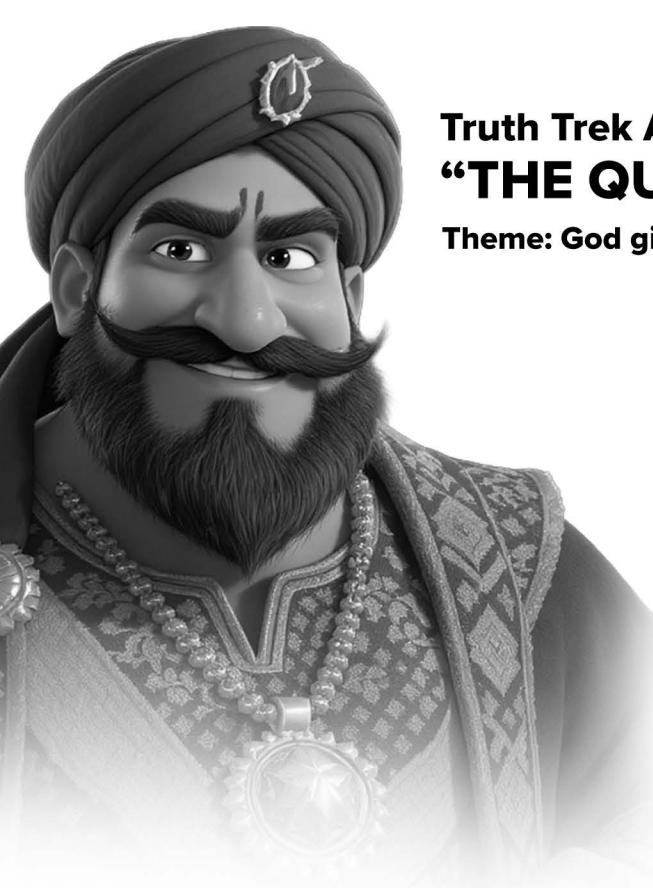
Lesson Summary:

- Esther was a young woman who loved God.
- The king of Persia chose her to be his queen.
- An evil man named Haman wanted to hurt God's people.
- Esther's cousin, Mordecai, told her what was happening.
- Esther could have stayed quiet — but she prayed and asked God to help her be brave.
- She went to the king, even though it was dangerous, and told him the truth.
- Because Esther trusted God, her people were saved!

2. How did she show kindness and faith?
3. Have you ever felt afraid to do the right thing?
4. When have you needed courage to do what's right?
5. How can we ask God for courage like Esther did?





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Theme: God gives us courage to do what’s right — even when we’re afraid.

A long time ago, in a land called Persia, there lived a kind and beautiful young woman named Esther. She wasn’t born a princess or a queen — just an ordinary girl being raised by her cousin Mordecai, who loved her very much.

One day, the king of Persia wanted to choose a new queen. He invited all the young women in the land to come to the palace. When Esther arrived, everyone noticed how kind, gentle, and wise she was. And guess what? The king chose her! Esther became Queen of Persia!

Even though she wore a crown, Esther didn’t brag or act proud. She still listened to Mordecai and remembered to trust God in everything she did. She was brave, kind, and caring — a queen with a big heart.

But trouble came to the kingdom. A mean man named Haman worked for the king, and he didn’t like Mordecai or God’s people. He made a terrible plan to hurt them all!

When Mordecai heard about it, he was heartbroken. He sent a message to Queen Esther that said,

“You must help us! Maybe God made you queen for such a time as this!”

Esther was scared. If she went to the king without being called, she could be punished! But she decided to trust God anyway. She fasted and prayed for three days with her maids, asking God to give her courage.

Then, with her heart pounding, Queen Esther walked into the royal court. The king saw her and smiled. “What do you need, my queen?” he asked.

Esther invited the king and Haman to a special dinner. 🍷 At the meal, she told the king everything — that Haman had planned to hurt her people. The king was shocked and angry! He stopped Haman’s evil plan right away.

Because Esther was brave, her people were saved.





Truth Trek Adventures Bible Lesson: “THE QUEEN THAT SAVED A NATION” ADULT DAILY DEVOTION

Devotion: “For Such a Time as This”

Scripture: “And who knows but that you have come to your royal position for such a time as this?” – Esther 4:14 (NIV)

REFLECTION

Esther didn't ask to be queen.
She didn't grow up dreaming of royal robes or palace halls.
She was a young Jewish woman, quietly living her life — until one day, everything changed. God positioned her in a place of influence not for comfort, but for courage.

When Mordecai sent word of Haman's evil plan, Esther faced a choice: stay silent and safe, or speak up and risk everything. It wasn't her power or her title that made her significant — it was her obedience. Her courage wasn't the absence of fear, but the decision to move through fear with faith.

We often wait for the “right time” to act, pray, forgive, or lead. But sometimes, the right time is now. Like Esther, you may not fully understand why you're in the position you're in — the job, the ministry, the city, even the hardship — but God does. You're not there by accident. You're placed there with purpose.

DEVOTIONAL THOUGHT

Esther reminds us that divine moments rarely come wrapped in comfort. They come disguised as decisions — moments when you must choose faith over fear, obedience over ease, and purpose over preference.

You don't have to be perfect to be chosen.
You just have to be willing to say, “If I perish, I perish — but I will go.”

PRAYER

Lord, help me see that You have placed me where I am for a reason.
When fear whispers that I'm not enough, remind me that Your strength is made perfect in my weakness. Give me the courage to speak, act, and love boldly — because this moment, this season, this challenge... might be my “such a time as this.”
Amen.

CHALLENGE

Today, take one bold step in faith. Call that person. Apply for that opportunity. Speak truth where silence feels easier. Remember — your obedience today could be someone else's deliverance tomorrow.

when it's hard. Amen.”





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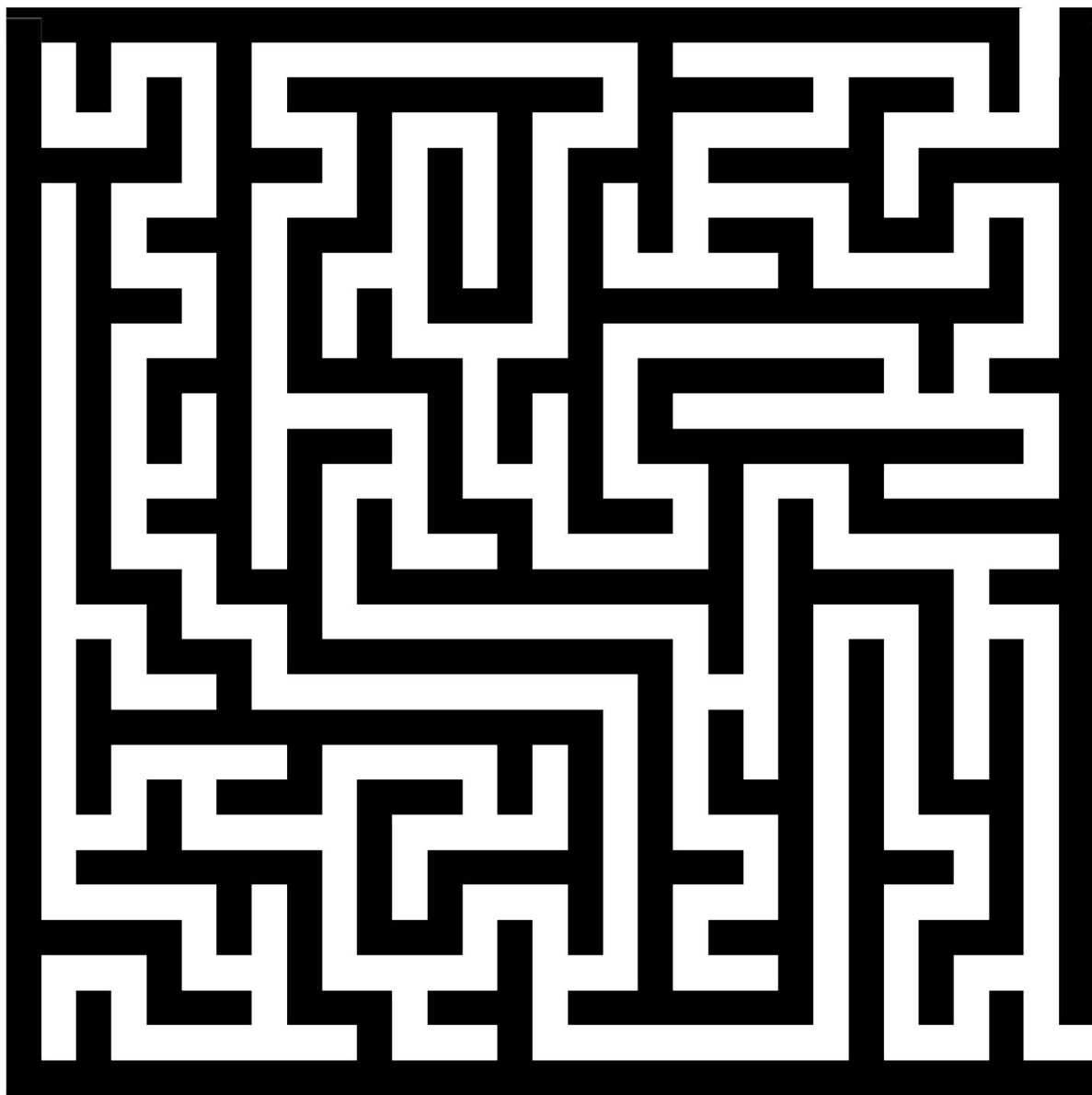

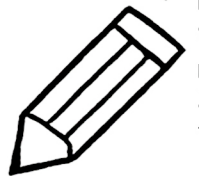
